#### Our Council supports "See You In Nanaimo"

At our last general Council meeting in November, we were honoured to have Cpl. **John Blaase** of the **Nanaimo RCMP** detachment speak to us about a very important and worthwhile community initiative.

In 2005/2006 the Nanaimo RCMP in co-operation with community groups, ICBC, City of Nanaimo, and the Nanaimo Safer Cities Committee. launched a traffic safety project called "See You In Nanaimo". In the year prior to its launch, the Nanaimo RCMP investigated four fatal and six serious injury motor vehicle/pedestrian incidents involving citizens over the age of sixty years who were wearing dark clothing in darkness or inclement weather. Investigation and research has determined that all of these deaths and injuries may have been prevented if the victims had been wearing something reflective. Since the launch of this project, Nanaimo did not have a single fatal pedestrian motor vehicle accident. The project consists of two stages. It begins with a media campaign to educate all pedestrians and encourage them to acquire and use reflective clothing/vests/armbands, in darkness or inclement weather. The second stage requires the acquisition of reflective wrist bands and distribution to seniors and other at risk pedestrians who can not get their own. This is where community minded sponsors come in - they are being asked to assist by purchasing armbands and then donating them to the "See You In Nanaimo" Project.

Considering this a most worthwhile cause, our Council passed a motion to buy 300 armbands in support of this initiative. We are very pleased to once again be able to join other community sponsors and contribute to this critical, life-saving safety program for seniors.
