The first of the eighteen apparitions of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** to the humble Bernadette Soubirous took place at Lourdes on February 11,1858. However, it was never proclaimed a dogma, until 1854. Hence, it is fitting that in 1992 Pope John Paul II, instituted the World Day of the Sick to be celebrated each year on 11 February. Its objectives are: to help sensitize Catholics about the quality of care being provided for the sick; to encourage Christian communities to be involved in pastoral health care; to recall the need to provide spiritual and moral formation for those working with the sick: to encourage the involvement of volunteers: to promote reflection on the meaning of suffering; and to invite all those involved in medical care to appreciate their healing mission.

Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities

On January 14, 2015, the **Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities** was submitted to the Supreme, State and District deputies. This report consists of all the activities our Council was involved in, the number of hours volunteered throughout the past year, total council activity expenses, and total charitable (church, community/needy, youth) disburs ements.

Here is a brief summary of those disbursements: Church, \$3,032; community/needy, \$7,955; youth, \$4,667; Life issues, \$200, for a total of \$15,844. In addition, we also spent a total of \$2,820 on council activities. The hours dedicated to volunteer charitable and fraternal service were as follows: Church, 2,852 hours; community, 911 hours; and an estimated 1,096 hours of other volunteer services, for a total of 5,024 hours.

Congratulations and a sincere thank you to all the Brothers who participated and volunteered throughout the past year in any and all of our activities. You are an example of what the Knights are all about; a living proof that by volunteering, we can make a difference; both in the parish and the larger community. Our thanks also goes out to Bros. Hans Fadum, and Claude Francoeur for supplying all the financial information, and to our D.G.K. Bro. Jerry Brown for collecting the volunteer statistics—thank you!
