From the desk of our Chaplain

Divine Mercy Sunday

What will the years ahead bring us? What will man's future on earth be like? We are not given to know. However, it is certain that in addition to new progress, there will unfortunately be no lack of painful experiences. But the light of Divine Mercy, which the Lord in a way, wished to return to the world through St. Faustina's charism, will illumine the way for the men and women of the third millennium. (Excerpts from Pope John Paul II's homily at the Canonization of St. Faustina on the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday 2000).

God has chosen our own times for this purpose. Perhaps because the twentieth century, despite indisputable achievements in many areas, was marked in a particular way by the "mystery of iniquity." With this heritage both of good and evil, we have entered the new millennium. New prospects of development are opening up before mankind, together with hitherto unheard-of dangers. Frequently, man lives as if God does not exist, and even puts himself in God's place. He claims for himself the Creator's right to interfere in the mystery of human life. He wishes to determine human life through genetic manipulation and to establish the limit of death. Rejecting divine law and moral principles, he openly attacks the family. In a variety of ways, he attempts to silence the voice of God in human hearts; he wishes to make God the "great absence" in the culture and the conscience of peoples. The message of merciful love needs to resound forcefully anew. The world needs this love. The hour has come to bring Christ's message to everyone: to rulers and the oppressed, to those whose humanity and dignity seem lost in the mysterium iniquitatis (the mystery of iniquity). The hour has come when the message of Divine Mercy is able to fill hearts with hope and to become the spark of a new civilization: the civilization of love. (Excerpts from a homily Pope John Paul II gave in 2002 at the dedication of the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Lagiewniki, Poland).

Dear Brother Knights, let the above words become our inspiration and motivate our every action as Christians, Catholics and Knights of Columbus of the third millennium. Have a blessed Easter Season.


Vatican declares Knights of Columbus founder "venerable"

Fr. Michael J. McGivney would be first American-born priest to be declared a saint

New Haven, CT - March 16, 2008 - Pope Benedict XVI Saturday approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Father Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus. The pope's declaration signifi-

cantly advances the priest's process toward sainthood and gives the parish priest the distinction of "Venerable Servant of God." If canonized, Fr. McGivney would be the first American born priest to be so honored.

"All of us who are members of the Knights of Columbus are profoundly grateful for this recognition of the holiness of our founder," said Supreme Knight **Carl Anderson**. "The strength of the Knights of Columbus today is a testament to his timeless vision, his holiness and his ideals."



The cause, or process, for Father McGivney's sainthood, was opened by Hartford Archbishop **Daniel A. Cronin**, in December 1997. The cause was presented to the Vatican in 2000, where it has been under review by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. With the pope's recent decree, and the authentication of a miracle at Father McGivney's intercession, the priest could be beatified. A second miracle would be required for canonization.
