Dr. Clement Persaud Speaks on Stem Cell research

Our Council was very pleased to have Dr. Clement Persaud speak to us on the science and ethics of stem cell research on Tuesday March 15. 2005, in St. Peters Church. Following the talk, light refreshments were served in the parish hall and all had a chance to mingle and talk with Dr. Persaud directly. We were pleased to have had over 120 people come out to this very timely and interesting lecture. Without exception, all were inspired and impressed by Dr. Persaud's clear, succinct explanation of this very complex and sensitive issue. Currently, there are two major sources of stem cells: embryonic and adult stem cells. Embryonic stem cells are still largely in the animal trial stages and, since they require destruction of the embryo, are ethically controversial and unacceptable. By contrast, adult stem cells (umbilical cord and adult-derived) are an ethical alternative. They have been used successfully in patients with neurological, leukemic, cancer, cardiac and genetic disorders. It is of fundamental importance to clearly differentiate between the two types of research: the first, embryonic, is morally totally unacceptable; while the second, adult, is not only acceptable but should be supported wherever possible.

Substance Abuse Poster Program

On behalf of Br. **Bill Smith**, I am pleased to report that we successfully completed our 2004 Substance Abuse Poster Contest on March 22, 2005. We started this campaign at the end of Aug. 2004 by requesting permission from the Nanaimo School Board to contact the 32 elementary schools in the Nanaimo area. We were immediately given permission, and all schools were contacted by email explaining who we are and what our program offered. Before school started in early Sept., we were invited to visit 29 schools to provide more detailed information. The principals of 20 schools were most impressed with the work kits supplied by the Knights and informed us that they would discuss scheduling our program into their school curriculum at their first staff meeting in Sept. and would recommend acceptance to their teachers. In late Sept. and early Oct., we received a commitment from 14 schools with scheduled completion dates from Dec 2004 to March 2005.

It should be remembered that in Nanaimo we do not have the benefit of offering this program to Catholic schools, so we must be a little more diligent in trying to help these public schools understand our objectives. I am pleased to say that we were very successful in this area. We were very well received and appreciated by the principals, staff and students of all the schools. This year both student and school participation tripled over last year: from 301 students to 927, and from 5 schools to 14.

We were invited as guests of honour to many of the school assemblies and were asked to speak briefly to the staff and the full student body about our work as Knights.

We were sometimes asked to help the teachers and students judge their drawings, and present winning and participation certificates during assembly excercises. We estimate that we have met or spoken to 1900 students and staff members; volunteered more than 200 hours visiting the schools (we visited each school a minimum of four times); and judged 52 winning posters in 4 categories submitted by the 14 schools. In conclusion, I wish to thank Br. Bill Smith, our Worthy Chancellor, publicly for his dedication and hard work during this labor of love and to the four judges who had the most difficult task of picking four winners to represent Nanaimo at the State level. The standards were very high, but Brs. Bill Smith and Brian King and our two judges from the C.W.L., Johanne Watson and Gerrie, my very supportive and patient wife, who also provided us with refreshments, struggled for 3 hours to find four winners. It should also be noted that through this program our Council has taken on the responsibility of financing one school with a breakfast program, another with a lunch program, and a third school with a Christmas Pancake breakfast. This is really being "Knights in Action" as our founder envisaged it! In the next few days we will post the names of the winners, their schools, and a complete set of pictures on our web site; please, look for them on the 'Gallery' page.
